## **1 WHAT IS THE SPEED CAMPAIGN?**

Speed is always a dangerous driving behaviour, which can have devastating consequences. The majority of people (at least occasionally) exceed the speed limit and latest figures show excessive speed was reported as a contributory factor in 21% of fatal accidents.1

Speed is a key priority for the Scottish Government and an integral part of the Road Safety Framework to 2030.

To tackle the serious issue of speeding on Scotland's roads, the Scottish Government and Road Safety Scotland (part of Transport Scotland) have launched a road safety campaign urging drivers to watch their speed and consider the severe consequences a

collision can have on the lives of many including the driver, their family, the victim's family, the emergency services and witnesses.

The Scotland-wide campaign highlights some of the excuses commonly used by drivers to justify their speeding behaviours, while reminding those behind the wheel that, if they're caught, they could face severe penalties such as losing their licence, a substantial fine, a criminal record, unemployment, and possibly even a prison sentence.

It doesn't matter if you think you're only speeding 'a little bit' - there's no excuse for speeding.

### **OVERALL CAMPAIGN MESSAGES**

- It doesn't matter if it's a little bit too fast or you didn't mean to, there's no excuse for speeding.
- Speeding can have devastating consequences on the lives of many.
- A collision involving speed affects more than just you and your car - it also has an impact on your family, the victim's family, the emergency services, and people who witness it.
- If you are caught speeding you could face severe penalties such as losing your licence, a substantial fine, a criminal record, unemployment, and a prison sentence.
- Latest figures show excessive speed was reported as a contributory factor in 21% of fatal accidents.<sup>1</sup>



- Common excuses for speeding are running out of petrol, the road being quiet, and keeping up with traffic also being perceived as exceeding the speed limit.
- Speed is a key priority for the Scottish Government and an integral part of the Road Safety Framework to 2030.

#### **SPEEDING**

- Research shows the majority of people (at least occasionally) exceed the legal speed limit:<sup>2</sup>
  - **33%** of people admit to exceeding the speed limit by 5mph in 30mph zones at least once in the past year.
  - **31%** of people exceeded the speed limit by 5mph in 20mph areas in the last year.
  - **8%** admit to having driven at least once in the past year at 90mph on the motorway.
  - **27%** of drivers admit to having sped up through amber at least once in the past year.
  - 13% admit they have exceeded the speed limit by 10 mph in a 30mph zone.<sup>2</sup>
