Being seen



Make sure that you wear something bright so that traffic can see you.

Using a bag



It makes sense to put things you are carrying into a pocket or bag leaving your hands free.

Using an underpass



It is safer to use an underpass when there is no other way of crossing the road.

Traffic light crossing



If there is an island in the middle of the road you will have to press the button and wait for the green man twice.

Reversing cars



You might see the back of a car coming towards you. This means the car is reversing.

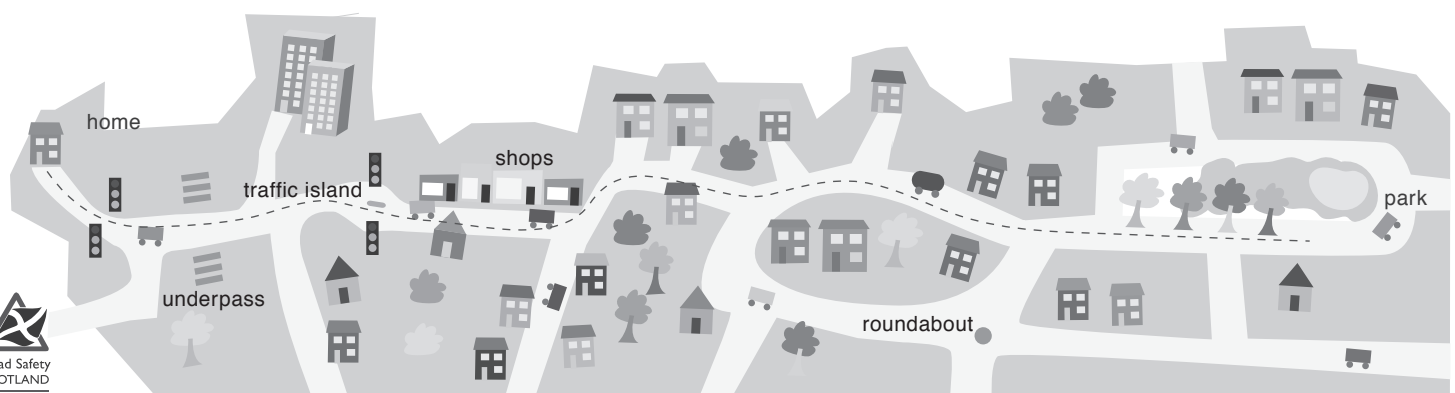
Front of cars



You can see the front of this car. You can also identify the back of a car.

Pavements



The pavement may not always be clean and dry.

Stop, think, look, listen



Even when there are two of you wait for the green man, at a traffic light crossing.

Obstacles



If the pavement is slightly blocked make sure you do not go onto the road.

Judging distance



You can tell by looking and listening if a car is close to you or far away.

Judging speed



You can tell by looking and listening if a car is travelling slowly or fast.

Barriers



The barrier is there to protect you from the traffic. It is are forbidden to cross here

You can tell by looking and listening how fast a car is going and which direction it is heading in.

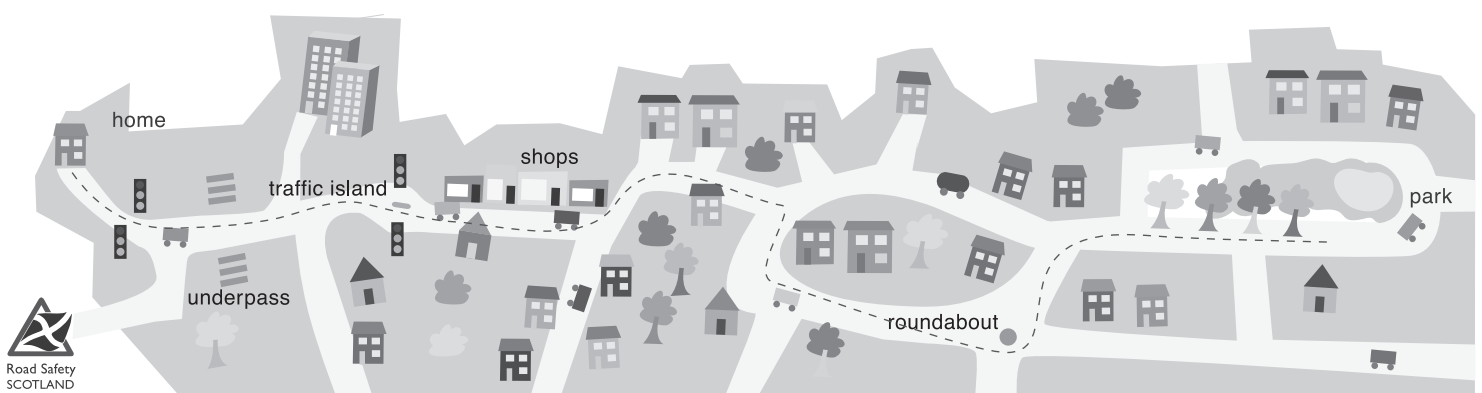
Crossing near a roundabout

Driveways



Always check that a driveway is safe to cross by looking in all directions.

Crossing at a hill



Your visibility is poor if you try to cross on the slope of a hill.

Crossing at the top of a hill



This is a safer place to cross. You have good visibility of traffic in all directions. Stop, think, look and listen.
